### **The Orienteering**

Map: 6 color 1:10,000 Produced 1992 for the World Cup, updated in 2001 and 2005. Beginner through advanced orienteering courses plus a Canoe-O will be available each day. Saturday night “Vampire-O” and the “Wicked Hard Night-O”.

Costs: UNO Members - \$5 advanced courses, \$3 Beginner (White/Yellow); Non-members - \$8 advanced courses, \$5 Beginner; \$2 for an extra map. E-punching will be used. Loaner punches are available.

**Check in and starts are 10am to 1pm on Saturday and 9am to noon on Sunday.**

Registration will be at the Group Camping Pavilion (follow Signs).

### **The Directions**

From Route 101 in NH, take Exit 5 and turn right on NH 107 North. Turn left on NH 27 and then immediately right on NH 156. Go 1.3 miles and turn left on Mountain Rd. Go 2 miles to the park entrance. Follow “O” signs to meet registration/ start.

### **The Camping**

We will be using the Group Camping area Friday and Saturday nights. This is where we camped last year. Rates are \$10 per adult and \$5 per child (under 18) per night. These sites are in the woods around the Group Camping Pavilion. You can drive your car near your site to unload and then park in the parking lot. This is very convenient to the Group Camping Pavilion/meet HQ. Lex and Pete Bundschuh are coordinating reservations for these sites. Site selection is first-come, first-served. Contact Lex and Pete (with name, nights and #Adults/Children) if you are interested in reserving a site so we can give your name to the park office. You need to stop at the Park Headquarters for a parking pass. The camping fee for the group camping area will be collected at Registration. If you have a camper or pop-up, or want to stay somewhere else in the park, you need to contact Reserve America directly (1-877-647-2757, or through the NH State Parks web site).

Of course you can also come for one or both days without camping. The Park will be charging a Day use fee to non-campers.

Sorry, no pets allowed in the park.

### **The Dinner**

You can run 1-2-or all 3 loops which start and finish at the pavilion. This will start shortly after the “Vampire-O.” You should be able to comfortably complete advanced courses (Brown/higher) in daylight, and must have two independent lights.
